SOLO REPORT: Frank Gaus:

October 12-13 was our last event, the Wounded Warriors benefit, and we will be sending \$3000. Frank provided balance sheets for this event and for the season, copies of which are attached to the archive copy of these minutes. We had roughly \$30,200 of income and \$22,600 of expenses, for a profit of \$7,600 for the year. Trophies will be sponsored by Motor Control Center again this year.

We averaged 91 drivers per event, and even managed to get 80-85 drivers at rain events.

We talked about the new pavement additions at Pitt Race – if it happens, and it is big enough, Frank will go to Howard Duncan about getting a National Tour event. That should even pull the Akron drivers to the event. The schedule for 2015 should be ready right after Thanksgiving, to make sure we don't conflict with National events.

Karen Fink finished 2nd in Novice in her first year. She came with her husband John.

We will probably need to replace our AC generator next year and buy about 60 new pylons. The old generator was purchased in 1999.

ROAD RACING REPORT: AJ Anselm

This weekend is the Great Lakes Region scheduling meeting. We already spoke with Ohio Valley Region, and their event is scheduled for the October 12 weekend.

Dave from PIRC says that September is available, but that would be bad because of the Runoffs. October 16-18 and 23-25 are available. NeOH is only doing a Spring event, and Mid Ohio has one 10/16-18. Should we bring back the Great Pumpkin?

For a Spring event, we're waiting to see if Vintage wants to participate in a school. Maybe a Double Regional April 24-26, the same weekend as the New Jersey 12-hours.

The Comp Board figured out the awards. Mark Keefer is Driver of the year. Mark Connolly finished third, and Jay Manno is Rookie of the Year. Ray Peterson is NeDiv AS Champion, and Neil Killey is SRF Champ.

OLD BUSINESS:

We had our first Majors meeting, and Paula took notes. There were 27 people there. The next meeting will be at PIRC on a Saturday, possibly 12/6. Start has already lined up 9-10 Starters. After the last STC meeting National (Terry Hanushek and Lisa Noble) took away the Double Conference status we were originally given. Lisa said she would try to do an article about the new track at PIRC in SportsCar to help us attract racers and sponsors. SCCA will sponsor the awards dinner. We have lined up vendors and pace car sponsors, but we need to find more. There is a meeting tomorrow.

We discussed the viability of a driver school and whether we can afford a National. There are too many variables now, and there are lots of scheduling meetings in the next two weeks. We will know more by the next monthly meeting.

Elections: Five petitions were received, from Beth Anselm, Mike Connolly, Bill Haus, Paula Hawthorne, and Walt Matenkosky, so according to our bylaws no 'election' is required and all five petitioners will get a seat on the Board of Directors.
